- Beginning at sundown on October 12, Jewish people throughout the world will begin to celebrate The Feast of Tabernacles which lasts for seven days. During this festival, Jews will be celebrating -
 - The beginning of the new year
 - The culmination of Passover events
 - The 40-year wilderness journey
 - The harvest
- The Feast of Tabernacles is also known as -
 - Sukkot, or the Feast of Booths
 - Shavuot, or the Feast of Weeks
 - Rosh HaShana, or the Feast of Trumpets
- As Jesus entered Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, what did the people do that is part of the Feast of Tabernacles -
 - Throw their cloaks on the ground
 - Wave palm branches
 - Run in front of a colt
 - Shout "Hosanna"
